Letter from the Vicarage.....

Between Easter and Pentecost?

It's not that long ago that we celebrated the birth of Christ and even more recently enjoyed our Easter celebrations. We could not have had Easter without Christ's birth. It's impossible to overstate the significance of Good Friday when Jesus died for our sins, and Easter Sunday on which he was raised from the dead — but Jesus's earthly ministry did not stop there. Following his resurrection, Jesus taught his disciples about God's kingdom for a further forty days before he ascended into heaven.

So, having 'done' Easter we now just simply wait for Pentecost, right? No, Jesus's ascension was not simply an afterthought to Easter and Good Friday. So, what's so important about Christ's Ascension?

It's Jesus's return to and reunion with his Father in heaven

Before and after his death and resurrection Jesus declares that he was sent by his Father and must return to his Father (John 16:28). When, as risen Lord, Jesus appeared to Mary he said, "Do not cling to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" (John 20:17). Jesus fully accomplished his mission and glorified the Father on earth, and at Jesus's ascension the Father glorifies the Son in heaven. Jesus's homecoming to his Father prepares the way for our homecoming to be with Jesus forever.

It is Jesus heavenly enthronement when he is installed as the true King of the world. The Apostles' Creed says, he "ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty." In Acts 7:56 Saint Stephen declares that he sees the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God. Is this a fulfilment of the prophecy in Daniel 7:13 -14? - look it up.

Jesus continues to work after the ascension

At the beginning of Acts, Luke writes, "In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus **began** to do and teach, until the day when he was taken up..." The small word 'began' signals that Jesus's ascension does not mean an end to his work as Messiah but a continuation - something we see in chapter 2 of the "Acts of the risen Lord Jesus," in which he works from heaven, through his people, by the Holy Spirit, for the accomplishment of God's purposes. God had promised, "I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh," (Joel 2:28) and this promise is fulfilled by the ascended Jesus. It is Jesus who sent the

Holy Spirit to be present with his people, to empower them for worldwide mission, and to transform believers to live new lives reflecting the exalted King.

Jesus is our heavenly mediator and high priest

During his earthly ministry Jesus's work was geographically limited but now he is at work everywhere and hears and responds to his people's prayers no matter the time or place, sympathizing in our struggles and promising to do whatever we ask in his name. Now in heaven the exalted Lord Jesus intercedes for his people as our true high priest and advocate. Jesus is the unique mediator between God and man. His death and resurrection have secured our forgiveness, justification, and reconciliation with our heavenly Father God.

Jesus will return as King and Judge

Two angels explain to the disciples, "This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." (Acts 1:11). Jesus's heavenly reign will one day be fully realized on earth and it's what we regularly ask when we pray, "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven". When he returns, the Lord Jesus will bring divine judgment, claiming his browbeaten people and judging his enemies.

So, often overlooked, the ascension completes Jesus's earthly mission and shows his enthronement as heavenly king. Jesus is presently reigning as king and remains active and engaged in our world and our lives. Jesus has completed his Father's mission and he now rules with all authority and intercedes for us as our mediator and high priest. You need to put Ascension Day in your diary now, and plan to be at one of our two services that day to celebrate.

Homeshare Comes to Acomb

Homeshare is a new service that matches an older homeowner with a younger person in a home-sharing arrangement. The Homesharer will provide 10 hours of support a week to the Householder in exchange for a room in their home. The service gives an older person the opportunity to continue living independently with the support and companionship of a sharer, whilst also providing a solution to young professionals or mature students in need of affordable accommodation.

In addition to resolving these practical issues, Homeshare matches often result in other benefits linked to intergenerational friendships. In similar services across the UK, participants have experienced reduced isolation, increased wellbeing and the opportunity to learn new skills.

Homeshare is a not-for-profit service, with a monthly contribution made by the Householder and Homesharer to cover the cost of the matching process and ongoing support.

Toria Morris, Homeshare Coordinator, explains: "Homeshare provides an alternative option for older people who want to stay in their own homes and for young people in need of an affordable place to live. There is also scope for matches to help to combat social isolation, too, so we're really excited about the difference it could make to the wellbeing of younger and older citizens in the Acomb area."


Six Weeks in Jerusalem

Give life this Christian Aid Week

Rachel Addis explores how your gifts this Christian Aid Week could help the world's poorest mums.

Tenneh Bawoh rests her three month old baby Ansumana on her lap. She bounces him on her knee and he giggles happily.

Tenneh and her baby have come to this humble Health Clinic in Sierra Leone for a check up. They are here with nurse Judith who delivered the baby in this room. Thankfully, both mum and baby are healthy.

But tragically Tenneh has loved and lost a baby before. A few years ago, when Tenneh was pregnant with her first child there was no health centre or trained nurse in her village. Thankfully, when Tenneh was pregnant a second time, things had changed for good.

Christian Aid's partner RADA saw that Tenneh and many mums like her were in desperate need of healthcare, and that's how Nurse Judith came to save lives.

But the health clinic where nurse Judith works is not enough to meet every need, the roof leaks and there are only two delivery beds, and at night there being no electricity, this makes giving birth even more dangerous. Every day ten women die in childbirth; but we believe every life is worth fighting for.

This Christian Aid Week, you could help give more mums and babies in Sierra Leone and around the world the greatest gift—the gift of life. Apart from donating towards Christian Aid, four ways you could help here in Acomb were outlined in the April Magazine.
